

A "Minion" Reasons to Read

In November, Alden Primary School is kicking off our brand-new reading incentive program titled "There are a Minion Reasons to Read!" To participate in the program, each $1^{\rm st}$ and $2^{\rm nd}$ grade student is being

asked to read at home for approximately 15–20 minutes a day for a minimum of 15 days a month (students are always welcome to read more than 15



days). Students will keep track of their at-home reading by filling out a short reading log that includes columns for book titles, dates, and student ratings for each book. Parents will also add their initials to the log. Kindergarten students will have a separate reading log that allows them to color a picture for each night that they read. All reading logs will be due the first day of the following month and the program will run from November through April. Students that participate in the program by meeting the 15 days of required monthly reading will receive a small reward each time they turn in a completed log.

If our building reaches the school-wide goal that has been set, the program will culminate with an exciting reading celebration in May. Students and families will be able to track our school's progress on the front bulletin board of the Primary School where each grade level will be competing with each other to have the highest participation.
